Treasurer's Report:

There is currently \$2,173.35 in the chapter account. This does not include the spring support check from MCCC. In March, we must prepare the chapter budget including officer stipends for approval at our General Meeting.

Day Bargaining Update:

President Barnes updated the Executive Committee on the schedule and pace of day contract negotiations.

Governor's Community College Proposal:

Copies of the proposal were distributed and discussion ensued about the various provisions of the proposal, their meaning and the union response. All shared concerns about the report. President Barnes will keep the chapter updated about coordinated statewide efforts to address the proposal. In the meantime, members are urged to discuss the proposal with their legislators.

Volunteers are needed to run the election.

Distance Education Committee:

The Distance Ed Committee has not met and we will raise this at MACER next week. We discussed concerns with the Teaching and Learning Center and the process by which courses are selected for compensation. Our current representatives on the committee are Gail Knell, Ralph Negron and Gail Guarino.

SAC Issues

We discussed the need to host a legislative breakfast.

Under-enrolled Courses:

Discussion began about concerns over under-enrolled courses: payment of and cancellation. Betsy Smith would like this to be brought to DCE MACER. Gail Guarino raised the point that 6.4 students enrolled in a course funds faculty salaries at Step IV. In her view 8 students should be considered fully enrolled for salary purposes. There was no consensus on this issue as discussion was cut off due to time and room constraints.
